<u>Bible memory:</u> Proverbs 3:5 is due on Thursday, October 2: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding."


<u>Sight Word Practice:</u> We are working on unit 4. The words will be tested on Friday, October 3: we, play, come, for, help

## PAT News

Hello, we pray that the first few weeks of school have gone well for everyone, and we would like to extend a warm welcome to all our new CLS families. The PAT is starting to think about the year ahead and thought this would be a good time to give you an overview of what PAT is, how we support the school, and the significant impact you as parents/caregivers can have in the life of CLS.

<u>What PAT is:</u> Parent Advisory Team. The PAT is made up school parents with the primary goal of supporting the school both financially, and through building community within our school families. We want to support each other as we help our kids grow both spiritually and academically.

<u>How we do this:</u> To support the school financially the PAT typically runs two to three fundraisers per school year. Community and connections are built through fun family events. The PAT is not separate from the school but a part of it. We work with Principal Jones, the teachers, and the students to help meet needs and make CLS a great place to learn and grow.

<u>Past Examples:</u> Through fundraisers, the PAT has been able to help the school purchase Chromebooks, make upgrades to the library, purchase new sports equipment, make upgrades to the playground and throughout the school, and provides an avenue to Government grants. Family events such as gym nights, sledding parties, and BBQs have helped bring CLS families together.

<u>Your Impact:</u> You are most likely reading this because you have a child (ren) in CLS, which means you can be part of the PAT. The PAT hold a monthly meeting that all CLS parents/caregivers are welcome and encouraged to attend. This is your opportunity to speak into, and contribute to, the life of our school.
